Pastor's Pen...

Christmas is my favorite time of year. I enjoy the lights, the festivities, the generosity, and feeling of joy that are all associated with Christmas. Easter and Christmas have vied for the most important service of the year for centuries. In the Eastern Orthodox churches, Christmas is the pinnacle Sunday. In western churches, it is Easter and the resurrection. Christmas was hardly celebrated in western culture until Charles Dickens made it popular through his writings.

Both Christmas and Easter celebrate God's love. "For God so loved the world that he gave his only son..." The birth of Christ is God's love letter to the world. Jesus' death and resurrection is the culmination of that love letter. In his death and resurrection, Jesus promises God's love, forgiveness, and reconciliation to the world. I, therefore, don't see it as a competition as much as one long message of love, peace, hope, and joy.

Advent is a season of preparation and expectant waiting. For four Sundays, we await the coming of the Christ child, the opening line of God's love letter. Like those awaiting a special package, or important email, we await the arrival of God's son. We know the story well, of the angels and shepherds, Mary and Joseph, the stable and the animals; but what changes each year is us. We hear the story slightly differently each year, because we have changed. Our lives and situations have changed. Our perspectives and priorities have changed.


What has changed in your life since last Christmas? What blessings and losses have you experienced? What accomplishments and disappointments have come your way? All of these change us in small and large ways. The Christmas story is the same, but how we see it can change dramatically from year to year.

This year, we are going to offer two unique ways of experiencing the Christmas story. We will, of course, have our traditional candlelight Christmas Eve worship on Tuesday, December 24th at 7:00 pm. We will sing familiar carols, and hear the story in a unique way designed for the whole family. This year we will also be offering a Blue Christmas/Longest Night service on Saturday, December 21st at 7pm. This service held on the longest night of the year is a service of healing where sadness and the hope of Christmas can share a space. Many are filled with sadness, or even dread, trying to simply endure the holiday season. If you are weary, join us this year, for this special worship of healing and prayer.

The power of God's love is one that meets us where we are. Whether we are celebrating or grieving, God's love surrounds, supports, strengthens, and sustains us. This December, may God's love fill your heart, soul, and mind.

And may you find ways to share that love throughout the Christmas season, and the whole year through.



Dear SUMC Church Family:

Similarly to what I wrote in last month's Newsletter, I want to thank those in the congregation, who continually support the financial mission of this church.

The financial results are nearly the same as reported last month:

- Giving through the end of September 2024 (\$136,385.47) continued to lag substantially from giving through the end of September 2023 (\$158,893.64).
- As described in last month's Newsletter, the church was experiencing a "summer slump" in giving.
   During a summer slump, giving tapers-off due to vacations, etc. Giving has shown improvement in October in comparison to September.
- Projected giving to the end of the year is down slightly from what was reported in the October Newsletter to \$ 183,000. The Budget for 2024 is approximately \$208,000

For the remainder of the Newsletter, below are various options available for giving to the church:

- <u>Sunday Morning Offering</u>. This is the traditional method of giving your tithes and offerings at the time
  of passing the plate during the worship service.
- <u>US Mail</u>. You can always mail your offering to the church, if you cannot attend on Sunday. It is
  strongly suggested that you <u>not</u> place any cash in the US Mail, due to mail theft, and send only checks.
  Giving by US Mail is a good way to continue to give to the church, when you are out-of-town.
- OnLine Giving. Several families are taking advantage of the OnLine Giving through ChurchTrac. As with the US Mail option, giving OnLine is a good method if you cannot attend on Sunday. If you are interested in OnLine Giving, visit the church's website to give online and click on the "Giving Tab" at the top of the page. If you have trouble giving OnLine, please contact Tony Goforth, Church Administrative Assistant, and he can walk you through the OnLine giving process.
- <u>Stocks and Bonds</u>. You can also donate stocks and bonds to the church. For stocks, this can be a tax
  advantage, particularly if you have a stock that has significantly increased in value. If you donate the
  stock, you can claim the appreciated value of stocks as a Charitable Donation and avoid the Capital
  Gains on those appreciated stocks. However, before using this method, you should first consult with a
  tax accountant!
- Other Real Property. While rare, in the past the church has received real estate as a tithe to the church.
- Qualified Contribution Deduction. If you have reached retirement age and are required to take a
  Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) from an IRA, you can send all or part of your RMD as a gift
  directly from your brokerage account to the church by using a Qualified Contribution Distribution
  (QCD). Before choosing this method, you should first check with your tax accountant.
  If you have any questions about the finances of the church, please feel free to call me.

In closing, as always, thanks to you, who have continued to faithfully give to the mission of the church. Thanks to all, who have caught-up their giving during the past month. May God continue to bless you in your giving.
