Pastor's Pen...

As we prepare for another trip around the sun, I am excited about the possibilities that God has presented to Sellersburg United Methodist Church. After a year and a half of getting to know everyone, it is time to start focusing on the future and all God has planned for us as a church and as individuals. Most thriving churches share 5 characteristics in common: Radical Hospitality, Passionate Worship, Intentional Faith Development, Risk-Taking Mission and Service, and Extravagant Generosity.

This year, I want to focus on two of these that I think are the foundation of all of the others. They are Intentional Faith Development and Risk-Taking Mission and Service. Jesus' final message to his disciples before his death was, "As I have loved you, so you must love one another" (John 13:34). His final message after his death and resurrection was "Go and make disciples of all nations" (Matthew 28:19). Faith Development and Risk-Taking Mission and Service should be at the heart of everything we do.

My first focus is Risk-Taking Mission and Service. We need to be constantly searching for ways to share God's love in real and practical ways. It is common for churches that are struggling, as ours is, to turn inward and focus on survival. In the last week, I have heard of two United Methodist Churches that will be closing soon. This human desire to focus on survival, though, is counter-intuitive to how we break out of the

cycle of decline. We must keep our focus on sharing God's love, even when it hurts, even when it means taking risks.

To this end, we have re-ignited our Missions Team, and I have charged them with planning a mission strategy that is Risk-Taking and will get our focus back on sharing God's love. This group is focused on creating risk-taking missions and service opportunities throughout the year. Their first will be our annual Souper Bowl soup contest in early February.

My second focus for 2025 is Intentional Faith Development. Thriving churches have near 100% participation in faith development. This includes, but is beyond simple coming to church on Sunday mornings. John Wesley summed it up in talking about prayer. "In souls filled with love, the desire to please God is a continual prayer" (from A Plain Account of Christian Perfection). Our desire to please God and to grow closer to God, should be a daily, continual desire and should guide our actions.

My hope is to get each and every one of you to focus more of your attention and time on this endeavor. Over the course of the year, I plan to introduce and lift up tools and practices that will help us achieve this goal. While having everyone attending a Bible Study or small group would be great, I realize that this may not be practical for everyone. However, there are many practices and guides that can be done as individuals or as groups. I plan to introduce the first, a devotional I am creating, in mid-January.

My prayer is that you will engage with me in this endeavor, that you will see the power and possibility of Risk-Taking Mission and Intentional Faith Development, and that together we will transform our church, and then the community, and then the world so that "thy kingdom come on earth as it is in heaven."

After she and Bob volunteered to visit our shut-ins for a few months, she felt called to accept the paid position in October of 2001. Since that time, Kathy has faithfully visited our homes, assisted living homes, nursing homes and hospitals with members. Her many greeting cards brought joy, laughter, hope and comfort in whichever season or stage of life we found ourselves. She also was present at the numerous funerals of members whenever possible, bringing comfort with her empathic spirit. She lived in South Bend during her formative years but during high school, she attended 4 different schools due to family moves. With the year 2024 quickly coming to an end, below is a quick recap of SUMC's finances, as of mid-December:

- Total Income for 2024 is approximately \$ 29,000 less than this time in 2023.
- Giving through the middle of December has shown an improvement over previous months this Fall.
- The projected giving through the end of 2024 is approximately \$ 183,000. The 2024 Budget is approximately \$ 208,000. With the decrease in giving, the 2025 Governing Board will be faced with significant challenges.
- All the financial obligations of the church have been met, including those to the UMC.

The financial report for year 2024, will not be available until the end of January, after the Accounting Books have been closed.

In closing, in early August, 2024, I reported to the Governing Board that I would not be continuing as SUMC Financial Director in 2025. This was a difficult decision after many weeks of prayers and discussions with friends and family. As stated in Ecclesiastes 3, "... to everything there is appointed a season." So, I have found that my season of service is ending. Lori Rice will be the new Financial Director beginning in January.

I want to take this opportunity to thank the pastors, Administrative Boards, and Governing Boards for their support during the last several years. I also want to thank Connie Nunn, Church Treasurer, who works behind the scenes, writing checks and keeping the Accounting Books for the church, without credit or recognition. Lastly, I want to thank the congregation for your support, encouragement, and most of all your trust. I have not taken your trust lightly.

Lastly, I want to add a personal testimony on giving. When Kathy and I first got married and moved to Jeffersonville, we were fortunate to join a Sunday School class of young people at Park Place UMC, led by Jim Sagebiel. Mr. Sagebiel was an older and much wiser man. One of the lessons that we taught was the blessings


